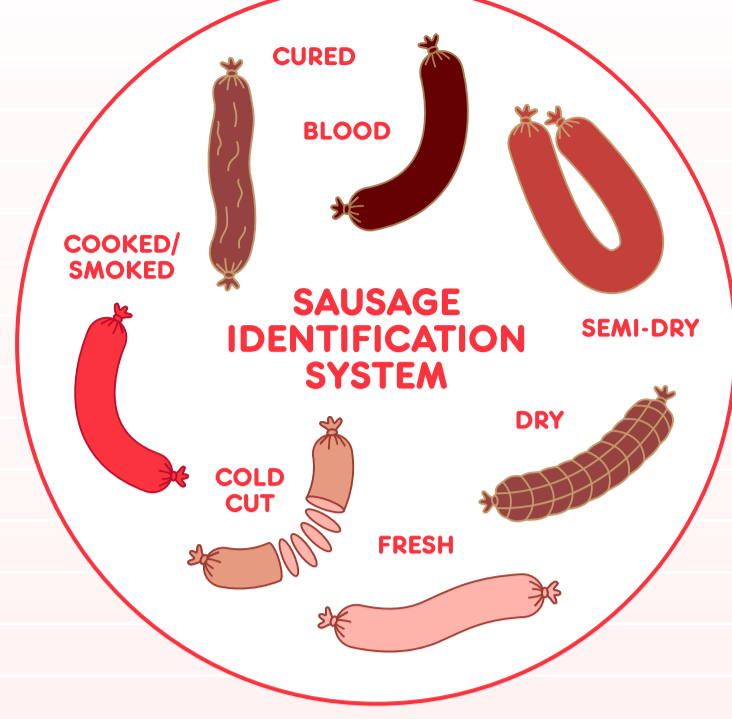


SAUSAGE

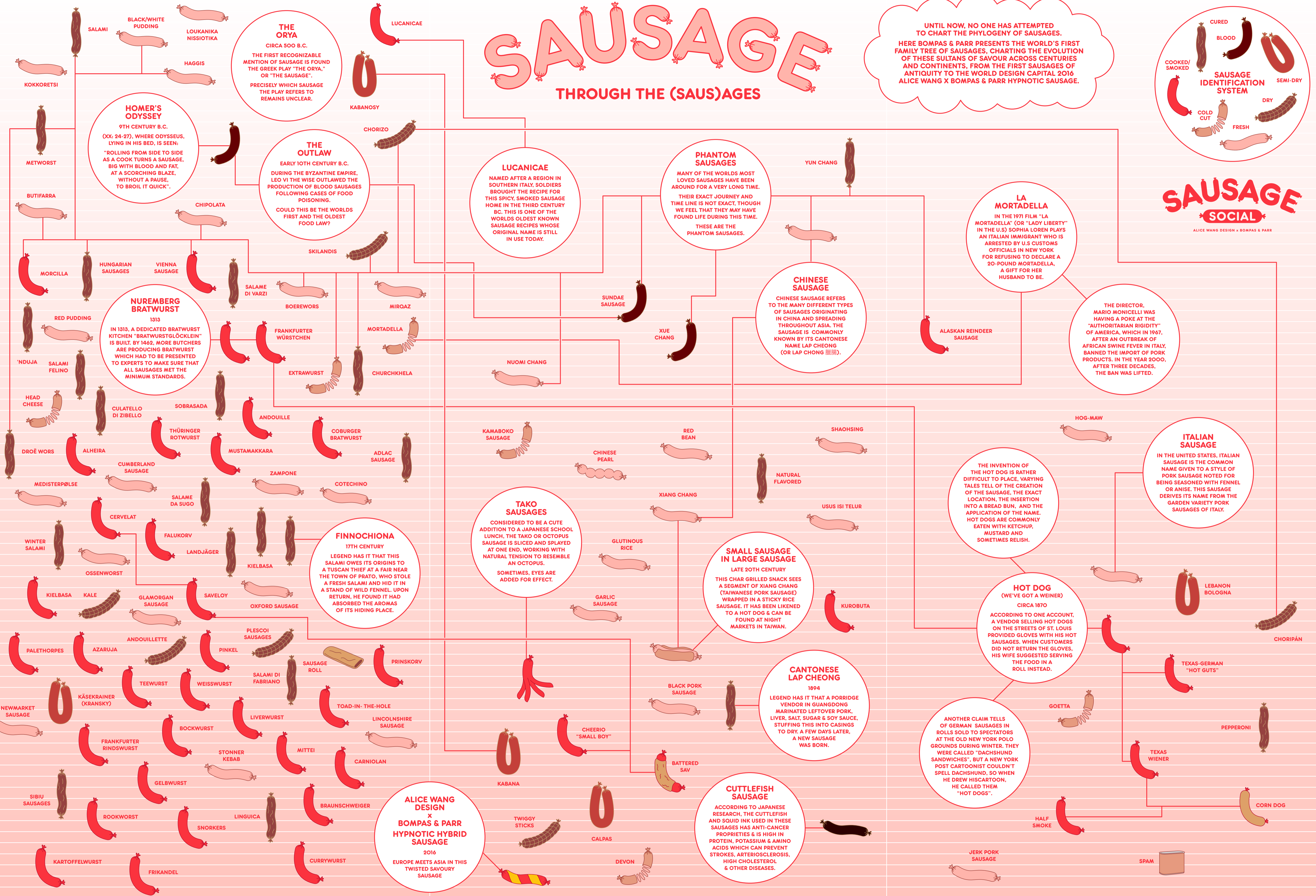

THE ORYA
CIRCA 500 B.C.
THE FIRST RECOGNIZABLE MENTION OF SAUSAGE IS FOUND IN THE GREEK PLAY "THE ORYA," OR "THE SAUSAGE". PRECISELY WHICH SAUSAGE THE PLAY REFERS TO REMAINS UNCLEAR.

HOMER'S ODYSSEY
9TH CENTURY B.C.
(XX, 24-27). WHERE ODYSSEUS, LYING IN HIS BED, IS SEEN: "ROLLING FROM SIDE TO SIDE AS A COOK TURNS A SAUSAGE, BIG WITH BLOOD AND FAT, AT A SCORCHING BLAZE, WITHOUT A PAUSE, TO BROIL IT QUICK".

THE OUTLAW
EARLY 10TH CENTURY B.C.
DURING THE BYZANTINE EMPIRE, LEO VI THE WISE OUTLAWED THE PRODUCTION OF BLOOD SAUSAGES FOLLOWING CASES OF FOOD POISONING. COULD THIS BE THE WORLD'S FIRST AND THE OLDEST FOOD LAW?

LUCANICAE
NAMED AFTER A REGION IN SOUTHERN ITALY, SOLDIERS BROUGHT THE RECIPE FOR THIS SPICY, SMOKED SAUSAGE HOME IN THE THIRD CENTURY B.C. THIS IS ONE OF THE WORLD'S OLDEST KNOWN SAUSAGE RECIPES WHOSE ORIGINAL NAME IS STILL IN USE TODAY.

PHANTOM SAUSAGES
MANY OF THE WORLD'S MOST LOVED SAUSAGES HAVE BEEN AROUND FOR A VERY LONG TIME. THEIR EXACT JOURNEY AND TIME LINE IS NOT EXACT, THOUGH WE FEEL THAT THEY MAY HAVE FOUND LIFE DURING THIS TIME. THESE ARE THE PHANTOM SAUSAGES.

LA MORTADELLA
IN THE 1971 FILM "LA MORTADELLA" (OR "LADY LIBERTY" IN THE U.S.) SOPHIA LOREN PLAYS AN ITALIAN IMMIGRANT WHO IS ARRESTED BY U.S CUSTOMS OFFICIALS IN NEW YORK FOR REFUSING TO DECLARE A 20-POUND MORTADELLA, A GIFT FOR HER HUSBAND TO BE.

THE DIRECTOR, MARIO MONICELLI WAS HAVING A POKE AT THE "AUTHORITARIAN RIGIDITY" OF AMERICA, WHICH IN 1967, AFTER AN OUTBREAK OF AFRICAN SWINE FEVER IN ITALY, BANNED THE IMPORT OF PORK PRODUCTS. IN THE YEAR 2000, AFTER THREE DECADES, THE BAN WAS LIFTED.

ITALIAN SAUSAGE
IN THE UNITED STATES, ITALIAN SAUSAGE IS THE COMMON NAME GIVEN TO A STYLE OF PORK SAUSAGE NOTED FOR BEING SEASONED WITH FENNEL OR ANISE. THIS SAUSAGE DERIVES ITS NAME FROM THE GARDEN VARIETY PORK SAUSAGES OF ITALY.

THE INVENTION OF THE HOT DOG IS RATHER DIFFICULT TO PLACE, VARYING TALES TELL OF THE CREATION OF THE SAUSAGE, THE EXACT LOCATION, THE INSERTION INTO A BREAD BUN, AND THE APPLICATION OF THE NAME. HOT DOGS ARE COMMONLY EATEN WITH KETCHUP, MUSTARD AND SOMETIMES RELISH.

HOT DOG
(WE'VE GOT A WEINER)
CIRCA 1870
ACCORDING TO ONE ACCOUNT, A VENDOR SELLING HOT DOGS ON THE STREETS OF ST. LOUIS PROVIDED GLOVES WITH HIS HOT SAUSAGES. WHEN CUSTOMERS DID NOT RETURN THE GLOVES, HIS WIFE SUGGESTED SERVING THE FOOD IN A ROLL INSTEAD.

ANOTHER CLAIM TELLS OF GERMAN SAUSAGES IN ROLLS SOLD TO SPECTATORS AT THE OLD NEW YORK POLLO GROUNDS DURING WINTER. THEY WERE CALLED "DACHSHUND SANDWICHES", BUT A NEW YORK POST CARTOONIST COULDN'T SPELL DACHSHUND, SO WHEN HE DREW HIS CARTOON, HE CALLED THEM "HOT DOGS".

SMALL SAUSAGE IN LARGE SAUSAGE
LATE 20TH CENTURY
THIS CHAR GRILLED SNACK SEES A SEGMENT OF XIANG CHANG (TAIWANESE PORK SAUSAGE) WRAPPED IN A STICKY RICE SAUSAGE. IT HAS BEEN LIKENED TO A HOT DOG & CAN BE FOUND AT NIGHT MARKETS IN TAIWAN.

CANTONESE LAP CHEONG
1894
LEGEND HAS IT THAT A PORRIDGE VENDOR IN GUANGDONG MARINATED LEFTOVER PORK, LIVER, SALT, SUGAR & SOY SAUCE, STUFFING THIS INTO CASINGS TO DRY. A FEW DAYS LATER, A NEW SAUSAGE WAS BORN.

CUTTLEFISH SAUSAGE
ACCORDING TO JAPANESE RESEARCH, THE CUTTLEFISH AND SQUID INK USED IN THESE SAUSAGES HAS ANTI-CANCER PROPERTIES & IS HIGH IN PROTEIN, POTASSIUM & AMINO ACIDS WHICH CAN PREVENT STROKES, ARTERIOSCLEROSIS, HIGH CHOLESTEROL & OTHER DISEASES.

TAKO SAUSAGES
CONSIDERED TO BE A CUTE ADDITION TO A JAPANESE SCHOOL LUNCH, THE TAKO OR OCTOPUS SAUSAGE IS SLICED AND DISPLAYED AT ONE END, WORKING WITH NATURAL TENSION TO RESEMBLE AN OCTOPUS. SOMETIMES, EYES ARE ADDED FOR EFFECT.

FINNOCHIONA
17TH CENTURY
LEGEND HAS IT THAT THIS SALAMI OWES ITS ORIGINS TO A TUSCAN THIEF AT A FAIR NEAR THE TOWN OF PRATO, WHO STOLE A FRESH SALAMI AND HID IT IN A STAND OF WILD FENNEL. UPON RETURN, HE FOUND IT HAD ABSORBED THE AROMAS OF ITS HIDING PLACE.
